Key Partner	Provision
IntoUniversity	We work closely with IntoUniversity who provide two workshops a year to students in all Year groups. The programme supports our students by offering academic support, mentoring, internship/work experience opportunities and focus programmes. This additional support is vital for aspirations
Westminster Partnership	The Westminster Partnership identifies and funds opportunities for sixth form students to experience higher education and Oxbridge applications
Business in the Community	Our business partner meets with us to identify opportunities for students to improve and apply employability skills as well as supporting careers fairs and talks
London Enterprise Adviser Network	Working with our business partner, The Marriott Hotel Group, we are able to apply a strategy to our careers provision. The students also benefit from work experience opportunities, one to one interviews (Year 10) and face to face meeting at the careers fair
London Business school	Our successful partnership with the London Business School is now in it's fifth year. Year 12 students are offered world class lectures on business/economics subjects throughout the autumn and spring terms. The student experience is high quality
NCS	Year 11 and 12 are given the opportunity to take part in the National Citizen Service opportunity where students are able to develop their confidence, meet new people and take part in a community project
Kings College London	The Realising Opportunities programme offered by KCL is a competitive application programme to support students understanding of what skills are expected in an academic environment. Students develop research skills and critical thinking through an academic assignment, take part in an ementoring programme and visit another RO participating university for a student conference
UCL	UCL add to the enrichment programme by offering clubs after school and a Next Top Doctor programme for Year 10 and 12 students during the spring term
Circl	Circl has provided Year 12 and 13 students with invaluable access to careers through tutor talks and a Facebook coaching programme
Institute of Engineering and Technology	The IET supports the Faraday Challenge where students work in teams against other schools to design, produce and present an idea to enhance the, already existing technology, of a given project
Diana Award/KPMG	The Diana Award is helping potentially vulnerable young people to develop confidence and strategies to support them in life by matching them with a mentor from KPMG. The students also visit the offices of KPMG and devise a social action plan with their mentors
Unifrog	Students in year 12 use Unifrog to access information about careers, careers pathways, routes into employment and HE/FE course information
Duke of Edinburgh Award	As part of education with character students in Years 10 and 12 are invited to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme. As well as the activities required of the course the students work closely with PiP (Pursuing Independent Paths) by supporting sport activities and raising funds. PiP also offer work experience to students in Year 10
Changing Education	Provide work placement opportunities for students in Year 10 and 12
ASK Apprenticeships	Give up to date information to students regarding apprenticeships through talks, Careers Fair and application process follow up activities
